The Good Samaritan Hospital serves the DR's vulnerable Haitian population. On this trip we will serve in medical clinics in surrounding villages and construction work on the hospital. There is space for current and retired medical workers, skilled construction workers, and folx with willing hands and hearts to serve as needed.

We expect more detailed information regarding costs and travel details in the next few weeks. If you are interested in joining or supporting this trip, please plan to come to an **information meeting** following worship on Sunday, October 20th.

If you can't join us on the trip itself, there will be opportunities to support this team financially and to donate medical supplies. Additional information to follow.

- **Treasurer** The treasurer works in conjunction with the bookkeeper to oversee the financial workings of the church.
- Building and Grounds Liaison The B & G Liaison represents the B & G ministry group to the cabinet, attending a monthly cabinet meeting. B & G oversees building needs and projects, building use, the Sexton, and maintenance contracts. These are the folx responsible for keeping this building beautiful and welcoming!
- Congregational Life and Fellowship Liaison The CLF Liaison represents the CLF ministry group to the cabinet, attending a monthly cabinet meeting. The CLF ministry group plans and oversees fellowship events, coffee hour, and special receptions and celebrations. These are the folx responsible for all things tasty!
- Mission Education and Projects Liaison The MEP liaison represents the MEP ministry group to the cabinet, attending a monthly cabinet meeting. The MEP ministry group oversees mission education and projects, promotes social justice advocacy and education, oversees the four special denominational offers, and develops hands-on missions projects. These are the folx responsible for leading practical ways for us to serve as Christ's hands and feet around the nation and world!
- Additionally, all of our groups are seeking new members to do a variety of things! Our teams are Building and Grounds, Christian Education, Congregational Life and Fellowship, Mission Education and Projects, Visitation and Care, and Worship Planning and Arrangements.


History Corner


Notes from our earliest records:


"A meeting was called about the middle of May, nineteen hundred, by a special committee appointed by the R. I. Free Baptist Association consisting of the Rev. J. M. L—, Rev. H. C. Lowden, Rev. Arthur Given, Daniel D. W— and Thomas D—, to consider the advisability of organizing a Free Baptist Church at Eden Park.

The meeting was held at the Mr. Thomas D—-'s on Pontiac Ave and about a dozen families on the plot were represented.

It was decided to organize and the committee were instructed to make arrangements for the recognition of a church body to be called the Phillips Memorial Church by the Association. The committee perfected the arrangements for the service to be held June 25th for which the People's Free Baptist Church at Auburn kindly offered the use of their sanctuary. It was afterwards found to be the fact that the organization took place on the fifth anniversary of the death of Rev. James L. Phillips, DD, for whom the church was named."

JOY Praise Team, Chancel Singers, and Sanctuary Ringers rehearse at their regular time on Thursday evenings.


Chime Choir will rehearse immediately following worship on 10/6. The rehearsal previously scheduled for 10/20 is cancelled.


